Communication Tools

Instant messaging and chat tools: These tools help teams quickly send chat messages. They are great for quick back-and-forth communication and for asking someone a question about a specific topic. Chat threads can be organized into channels by conversation topic or by team.

Slack

Video conferencing tools: These tools help you set up video meetings with multiple people, so you can see your team. You can use your phone to call into these meetings when you are on the road or call in directly over your computer. All you need is a camera, which often comes stock on your phone or computer.
